

Regulation 2022/2292 amended by Regulation 2023/2652 on import requirements for honey (and other apiculture products) for human consumption

WHY

- ✓ Consignments (of honey (and other apiculture products) for human consumption) must come from establishments that appear on lists drawn up and updated by the competent authorities of the countries of origin.

- ✓ EU Border control posts will accept honey with no requirement of establishment listing until **28 November 2024**.

- ✓ EU border control posts will accept honey only if the establishment is officially listed at the time of entry in the EU from **29 November 2024**.



To take into account **transport delays**, third countries must be in compliance long enough before November 29th.

Third countries authorities
to guarantee that:

WHAT

- ✓ Consignments come from establishments complying with the requirements in hygiene Regulation 852/2004;
- ✓ They keep an up-to-date list of these establishments;
- ✓ They conduct regular and effective controls of these establishments;
- ✓ Consignments are accompanied by a health certificate in accordance with the model as in Chapter 45 of Annex III to Regulation 2020/2235.

Not subject to list obligations:

- ✓ Primary production;
- ✓ Transport operations;
- ✓ Storage of products of animal origin not requiring temperature-controlled storage conditions.

List submission on TRACES portal by third countries competent authorities:

HOW

- 1 Create an EU Login account ([Login \(europa.eu\)](#));
- 2 Request a new role as "National Contact Point" ([link](#));
- 3 Wait for your role to be validated as Administrator;
- 4 Accept the role request as "National Contact Point" of colleagues ([link](#));
- 5 Add the establishments to an existing list of their country or create a new list;
- 6 Submit list for examination.

First scenario:

Request confirmed by the European Commission, no amendments or further documentation needed.
